Revision Studios of High Rolls has completed principal photography on a new documentary about a very old car. The Maxmobile was first invented by Max Mitchell's great uncle, David Maxwell, in Watford, Ontario, Canada in 1900.

David Maxwell, a blacksmith, invented the first car in Canada to be completely built by one man. He also invented a carburetor and cantilever springs which got the interest of Henry Ford and McLaughlin Buick. Mr. Ford wanted David Maxwell to move to Detroit and be his partner but Mrs. Maxwell wouldn't move to the big city and leave family, friends and small town life behind. Only one of the cars Mr. Maxwell created is still in existence and 107 years later it still runs! The car is in the Watford Museum in Canada and was restored for the town's 1973 centennial. A one cylinder, chain-drive machine, the Maxmobile became famous for removing ladies' skirts when they got caught in the chain. More www.revision-studios.com
